Message From Our President

When my mother passed away in late September my world collapsed inward for a time. Even my lungs hurt (how can grief make your lungs hurt...?).

When a beloved dog moves on, the pain can be nearly as intense. Over time (yes, that cliche'), though the person or dog is not physically next to us, we can hear them in a crowd or on a breeze from a distance. We turn, expecting what we know we can't have, and if we are lucky we smile. That's what memories do. They keep the one we have loved and lost alive.

In the animated movie Coco (a worthwhile download if you haven't seen it), the premise is that nothing leaves this world until the last person forgets. Holding onto memories takes on a new context with that thought, and allowing ourselves to grieve allows us to find the most precious memories to save. I can hear my Mom's laugh, remember a key phrase of hers (one that annoyed me, in most cases, but makes me smile now). I can feel a wet nose nudging under my arm to spill my coffee, smell the fresh baked bread scent that was oddly right on the top of one dog's head when I was kissing her. And those make it possible to walk with head high and feet forward.

LOVE CAME FIRST

You don't move on after loss, but you must move with it.

You must shake hands with grief, welcome her in, for she lives with you now. Pull her a chair at the table and offer her comfort. She is not the monster you first thought her to be. She is love. And she will walk with you now, stay with you now, peacefully. If you let her. And on the days when your anger is high, remember why she came, remember who she represents. Remember.

Grief came to you, my friend, because love came first.

Love came first.

I didn't write that. I found it when a friend had suddenly lost her 12 year old dog and was in despair. And I read it often. For all of us who have lost, they are wise words. Love came first.

I wish you all peace in your hearts and music in your souls as we embrace the cooler days and darker evenings. The holidays are approaching, as well as our specialty on Jan. 2 - mark your calendars. (Premium list is at dogzibit.com.) Love your dogs more than ribbons, and tell the precious ones in your life that you love them. Often.

Rosie, Manions American Beauty Rose 4/2/16 - 9/23/24



Getting To Know You

To make a very long story shorter: I started with a Weimaraner in obedience competition in the nineties that I acquired from my Mom at 16 months. Crazy and out of control, I learned in a group class that there was this thing called obedience competition. That was my start! I then moved on to Border Collies and dabbled in herding (Herding Excellent titled), some conformation, obedience (UDXs) and agility over the years.

But the reason I'm here today: Goldens. I had always loved Goldens but never really knew any personally. So it was an eye opener many years ago when I sat next to long-time club member Gerri Monohan at a show when she was showing her beautiful OTCH Lyric UDX10. I had never considered that such an accomplished dog would also be so sweet and sociable. I was completely charmed. That definitely put the Golden bug to work.

I got on a waiting list, but after waiting over two years for a puppy from a 'famous breeder' back east, I was eventually told there wouldn't be a dog for me in the litter. Very disappointing but as I was still working full time maybe it was for the best. Then six years ago I saw a Facebook post from a trainer in Georgia who was looking to place her three-year old field bred Golden because she was not interested in training or competing in obedience anymore and had switched to Border Collies and herding. Funny that I was switching the other way around!

Rush had done some heeling and retrieving but never saw a show ring and I knew I would have to start from scratch with him. I contacted Melanie Foster from Firemark Goldens who bred Rush and she was incredibly helpful and encouraging. After telling me about his lineage and what to expect she said that if it didn't work out she would always be willing to take him. That gave me all the confidence I needed, so off I flew to bring Rush home. And let me tell you, it was definitely love at first sight. This was the dog for me – and after a few years of training Rush really came out of his shell. He's my first OTCH and UDX4 OM6. He's in the Golden Retriever Hall of Fame for having at least 5 all breed High in Trials and has been a joy to show and live with since the day we came home. We've also done some therapy work which he's amazing at and has also been training in agility.



A couple of years ago he was diagnosed with testicular cancer, but after a major neuter his checkups have come back all clear. What a scare! He's nine now and we are slowing down our show days but I treasure every moment with him and I'm so happy to have had a 'heart dog' that I've heard people talk about so often. I definitely treasure every moment with him.

I did finally get my first Golden puppy a couple years ago! I flew back to Chicago and picked up Neo from Tanbark Goldens in Wisconsin. What a switch! Neo is a wild child and so challenging to train but happily for me he has that wonderful Golden temperament: he loves everyone and is sweet and appropriate with all the dogs he meets, and is so easy to travel with to all our shows. At two years old he seems to be getting his hormonal brain together so there's actually some hope for us moving forward. His scent work is amazing so we'll start competing in that and he already has a couple of the new Fetch titles as well.

I retired last year from legal administration work so now I have more time to train, give some obedience competition lessons, and work on my second career as a budding screenwriter!




