Message From Our President

Happy Summer to every GRCGLA member!

As the days heat up, it goes without saying that we must be vigilant about keeping our dogs safe. Every year there are tragic stories that break our hearts about dogs dying under the care of a handler, or exercised until collapse by a well meaning person who thought that their dog would indicate when it was too hot. Hearing of dogs in heat distress at an event, whether conformation, field, agility, or other performance venue leaves me wondering whose best interests were being held in highest regard. Is a win worth the risk?

If your dog travels with a handler, ask them directly about their hot weather protocols and when they will determine that they will not attend a show. It is not too insistent to discuss your fears and have them give the assurance you are looking for.

As you travel with your dog to outdoor events to compete, be sure you know whether shade will be available and if not — be sure that you take plenty to cover your dog's ex-pen or crate completely, and still allow good ventilation. It is always better to have one shade cloth too many than not enough. Choose shade cloth that gives airflow rather than an article such as a blanket. If you use an EZ Up, assure that you have sides to drop down for sun blockage or shade cloth and clips enough to do the same job. And there can never be enough water (frozen water bottles also work well to put in a crate or pen for dogs to drape across or wrap around). There are cool coats and cool pads available to purchase at shows or online, as well as fans (Ryobi fans are quite popular) to provide airflow.

Not only are dogs at risk of heat injury or death on the road at dog events, they are also susceptible to errors at home. Now is the time to check the electrical connections on all A/C units, fans, and ventilation systems that you have in your dog areas. Assure backup power in case of an electrical failure. Reinforce any shade cloth that looks worn, including grommets and clips. Ideally, provide an escape for your dogs to an outdoor area so that if there is a power failure, the indoor space will not become a hotbox.



In your car, think about what you will do if your car breaks down along the road and you have to move your dogs out of the vehicle. Have shade cloth and rope or clips that you can use to make a tented spot for them to be out of the sun away from the highway. Carry a cool pad for each dog that can be soaked and laid on the ground in the shade. Carry lots of water! Have sturdy leads and collars in case they need to be secured in a shady area.

All that being said (my paranoia being overactive because I have seen too many tragedies), summer gives us longer days and warm, breezy evenings; early mornings that are perfect for a walk or hike; and the opportunity to be with our beloved Goldens while we enjoy summer picnics and lazy days at the poolside. Stay well and stay cool!





Getting To Know You

Gerri Monohan Lifetime Member



As a kid, I inherited a Border Collie, Trolleycar, from my sister when she got married and moved into a tiny apartment. The BC had lived in my parent's house quite a bit before this, as my sister always lived in tiny apartments that were not conducive to owning a high energy dog. My parents' theory was that if you lived in a rural area your dog should have its freedom. This was in part because no one had fenced yards and Trolleycar broke every leash she was tied up with. She chased cars and garbage trucks, bit the newspaper boy, got in regular fights with a crazy Newfoundland that was ten times her size, was nearly killed by a neighbor for digging in his garden and brought back dead critters to deposit on our doorstep as a daily offering. I loved this dog! However, I had a friend who showed Basset Hounds and I was very disappointed to find out that Border Collies were not eligible for AKC events at that time.

When Trolleycar died from lymphosarcoma, I was devastated. I knew I couldn't possibly get another dog that reminded me of her, and I wanted a dog I could show in obedience. My mom's brothers raised Irish Setters and that intrigued me, but I was cautioned that if I wanted to do obedience I should consider a Golden Retriever instead. What on earth was a Golden Retriever?! Oh, they look just like Irish Setters but they're smarter. So, I bought a book about Golden Retrievers and, yes, they looked perfect! Off I went to the next Iowa City Kennel Club dog show, armed with my book, walked up to the first person I saw that looked like he had a Golden Retriever at the end of a leash and announced that I wanted to get a puppy. I was 17 years old and I'm sure a lot of people would have given me the brush off, but Dave Reynolds responded that his dog had won BIS the day before and was siring a litter of puppies. I had no idea what it meant to be Best In Show but that sounded pretty good. And thus, began my introduction to Golden Retrievers and responsible dog ownership!

The first club event I went to was a practice field trial which was held in the off season before AKC started the hunt test program. The spectacle of golden after golden doing what they were bred to do was the most wonderful thing I had ever seen! When Brandy, my new nine-week old puppy, snatched up a pigeon and happily paraded around with it, I was hooked. I had her retrieving triples with home-made bumpers before she was six months old. Brandy went on to earn a UD, TD, WC and WCX and if there had been more types of competition available then, I have no doubt she could have done them all!

Brandy could balance anything, including biscuits, tomatoes, bananas and even my pet mouse, Saint, on the tip of her nose. The only thing she couldn't do was show in conformation as she must have gotten into the grow tall juice and was a bit over standard. She lived to be almost 17 and I will never forget her.

This was the beginning of my lifelong love for Goldens and I have owned 12 more, participating in conformation, agility, hunt tests, obedience, rally and therapy dog work. When I lived in Iowa I was a member of the local breed club as it went through the process of being approved by AKC, and when I moved to Los Angeles I was just in time to go through the same process as GRCGLA became a formal club. I met a lot of nice people, held several positions on the board, including President, and also served as President of the rescue when it was still a part of the club. As much as I loved Golden Retrievers, I always wanted to get another Border Collie. And now I have Zasu, who is a dream come true. She has earned championships in Herding, Agility, and Rally, and with my Golden, Trip, together became the first

non-Bernese Mountain Dogs to earn Grand Master Draft Dog Titles. Recently, Zasu earned a position on team USA in the first ever Senior Open Agility World Championship to be held in Brussels, Belgium. I'm so excited for this new adventure!
